


USLNG Exports: Sept. 2021

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS (SEP)

- USLNG exports fell slightly as shipments from Freeport and Cove Point declined. Top destinations remained largely unchanged with exception of Turkey entering top-tier importers. On a 12-month rolling average, China is the top USLNG market for the first time.

TOP 5 DESTINATIONS (SEP)

- China (48.6 bcf)
- Brazil (38.3 bcf)
- S. Korea (31.4 bcf)
- Spain (31.3 bcf)
- Turkey (24.2 bcf)

REGIONAL BREAKDOWN (SEP)

- Americas, 75.9 bcf (25.5%)
- Asia, 163.2 bcf (54.8%)
- Europe, 55.6 bcf (18.6%)
- Middle East, 3.3 bcf (1.1%)


VOLUME EXPORTED (30 DAYS)

- 4.5% less than Aug. 2021
- 88.4% more than Sept. 2020

- 2 - Elba Island (-1 from Aug.)


Top USLNG Destinations - Past 12 Months


Regional Distribution of USLNG - Past 12 Months


Top 15 Importers of USLNG - Since Feb. 2016
